



Forestry 1 - Native Trees

Children take a walk through the woods with a guide to experience Mother Nature up close and personal. This tract is designed to teach children how to identify native trees by learning the shape of the bark and leaves.

Common trees covered are:

- Poplar
- Oak
- Maple
- Ash
- Elm
- Hickory
- Walnut
- Redbud
- and more



This walk includes a wagon ride to the woods. Deer, Turkey, Coyotes and John Deere's are also often seen as well. This tour can run thirty to sixty minutes depending on the age group.

Recommended ages five to ten.



Educational Program

Farm Animals

Children will tour a 105 year old restored farmstead with a wide array of farm animals found in the U.S.

We will discuss a variety of food products that come from the farm and what animals they come from. Older children will get a more in depth discussion of what part of the animal that various types of meat are located. Eggs, Milk and Cheese will also be discovered. If time permits and leaders agree, we will do a quiz and one good listener may get a chance to collect chicken eggs or milk a cow.
